LETTER FROM PR. MARK

Jesus said: No one comes to the Father except through me. (John 14:6)

Dear Friends in Christ:

You have probably heard the above phrase from the Bible at funerals. It is in response to Thomas' question: How can we know the way? Jesus responds: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life." It reminds us that on one can come into God the Father's eternal presence except through the merits of the Son, Jesus Christ. In other words, we cannot earn ourselves into eternal blessedness; it is only through the merits of Jesus Christ, and what he did for us on the cross, that we shall stand

in righteousness before God. We take on Jesus' righteousness because of the cross. Like the apostle Paul says, "we are justified by grace through faith, and not by any works of the law."


Does this sound too easy? This received righteousness does not mean we act immoral or that we intentionally commit sins. But we strive to love neighbor as ourselves because Jesus has already made us worthy. We practice righteous behaviour because Jesus has already made us righteous! To love one's neighbor completely is

difficult. We try and we fail. But we always have forgiveness when we turn to God in Jesus Christ.

Repentance is a turning to God, a returning to God -- nothing more than that. Repentance is not a "I can do better" experience, it is a "I can't- I need your help" experience. It is returning to our right relationship with God, who is always loving and forgiving.

Scroll to the bottom of the same page, and click on the Submit and Sign Up button.




ENTER COMMUNION PREFERENCE

1 25 PEOPLE MAX


Attendance will be limited to 25 worshipers in addition to worship leaders, tech crew, musicians, and ushers.

Attendees will be asked to make a reservation via on-line, or by calling/emailing the church. Zoom services will continue as well.



FOLLOW THE SIGNS / USHERS

Be sure to follow all signs and ushers. Entry and exit of the church will be through the main doors only. The doors will be propped open. A welcome station will be located at the entrance for people to check in, have their temperature taken, and offered hand sanitizer. Any persons with a temperature of 100 degrees or higher will not be admitted.



Masks are required at all times when in the building, AND when within 6 feet of parishioners outdoors.



PASS THE PEACE = PASS THE VIRUS
Sharing the Peace will not be offered in person, and

we will not leave our seats. When sharing the Peace, we will wave, and offer each other signs of Peace from a distance.



We will follow the guidance of the ELCA synod regarding distribution of Communion by using prepackaged contactless Communion elements.





Group recitation, or saying responses together as a worshiping community creates a "super spreader" danger. Please say the responses, prayers, and creeds silently.

MORTGAGE REDUCTION CHALLENGE BY DONAL BARLOW

From 2 Corinthians 9: "God can pour on the blessings in astonishing ways so that you're ready for anything and everything... This most generous God... is more than extravagant with you. He gives you something you can then give away... so that you can be generous in every way, producing with us great praise to

We have been challenged! Will we raise \$15,000 between now and November 15th? If we do, we will reduce the mortgage by \$30,000! That's right!

God."

On Sunday, October 11, the 2020 Mortgage Reduction Matching Challenge was announced Dennis Friedle; we have a sponsor to match dollar for dollar all contributions to reduce our mortgage principle, between Sunday October 11 and Sunday November 15 up to \$15,000.

In one week's time, \$1,050 has been given, which, when matched, becomes \$2100. Dennis told us about Meblessings, his receiving a

stimulus check which he and his wife do not need in order to have a home, clothing, food; he suggested that's one way for us to look at what we might give to this matching challenge. Look for others to speak about the Biblical perspective of giving and personal ways to view this challenge in the coming days.

These matching challenge donations should be in addition to your regular giving and not meant to replace your regular giving.

Our matching challenge last year was very successful in reducing our principle on the mortgage by \$20,000 which resulted being able to pay off the mortgage within 8 years. If we can be successful again this year it means we could pay off our mortgage in fewer years. What does this mean for our church? Of course, it would be awesome to have no debt! Of course, that would mean more certainty for having a pastor and maintaining our property. Even more than these things, it means that we can

contribute more to our ELCA mission for the Synod's world projects and help to our community. It would give all of us more of a chance to dream and hope for being God's hands
